As their acclaim grew, Sunadha toured the USA, UK, Malaysia, Thailand, and multiple Indian locations, captivating audiences on diverse stages with their performances. These exceptional artists receive frequent invitations to perform at prestigious events like the Hampi Utsav, and the Vishwa Kannada Sammelana (ACT) in Karnataka. 




PRANAY THAPA -THE VERSATILE MUSICIAN

Her journey in music is complemented by computer skills from Samarthanam Trust for The Disabled.

Currently, Head of the Department at Samarthanam's Institute of Music & Performing Arts, Anusha has performed on prestigious platforms like DKS Divya Kala Shakti Competition, ICCR, Kittur Utsav, and Hampi Utsav. Her soulful renditions have graced spiritual settings like the Udupi Radha Krishna temple.

Anusha's accolades include a gold medal at the Youth Festival (2019) and notable appearances on Zee Sa Re Ga Ma Pa (2024). Her story embodies resilience, passion, and the inspiring power of music.

GRANDHI BALA SUBRAMANYA- THE PEOPLE'S SINGER

Balasubramanyam hailing from Kakinada, Andhra Pradesh is a talented singer despite being visually impaired. He discovered his passion for singing at a young age and received free training in music and computer skills from Samarthanam. In 2014, he was introduced to Samarthanam during an Indian Council for Cultural Relations (ICCR) sponsored music concert. For the past nine years, Bala has showcased his singing abilities in various parts of the world as part of Samarthanam, including his debut performance in the US. He has also given concerts in the UK and North America, including the Vishwa Kannada Association (NAVIKA) in 2015 and an incredible performance at the World Bank USA program in 2018. Bala is proficient in all south Indian languages, Hindi and other popular Indian languages for him, singing is a means of expressing himself to the world, and with the training at Samarthanam, he has been able to connect with people through his music

Despite her challenges in communication and hearing, Shri Devi has found a way to connect with the world and express herself through dance, her graceful moves and expressions overshadowing her disability. It's hard to believe that she is hearing and speech-impaired, given her exceptional abilities.



BADESAHAB (Instrumentalist)- THE SOUNDTRACK OF RESILIENCE

Badesahab, a 30-year-old visually impaired musician from Dharwad, has mastered the Tabla, keyboard, and rhythm pad, earning widespread admiration. His fun-loving personality and deep connection to music shine through in every performance.

In just two years, Badesahab has performed at over 100 events, enhancing lead singers' music with his exceptional skills. Born in a city rich in musical heritage, his early passion for music was nurtured by his school for Tabla and later by Samarthanam, where he fully learned the keyboard. Badesahab's journey exemplifies how determination and support can lead to excellence in music.
